With the best of intentions, we as educators, policymakers, parents, school designers, and community activists design "intervention" programs to support young men and boys of color. However, we often get frustrated with the lack of results or outright failure of some of our initiatives when the outcomes are not what we expected. At the Sims-Fayola • Foundation, we believe the problem is in the planning - specifically, planning without including the input of the young men themselves. They rarely get a chance to be part • of their own solutions for one reason or another.

Our annual **Boys Are Talking Forum** is designed to give these young men a voice for planners to consider when designing initiatives. It not only gives them a seat at the table but a voice as well. The Forum provides a platform for the young men to share and describe the impact of the initiatives that have helped them reach their goals and achieve success, as well as those structures that have hindered them.
